“In assessing dogs, judges must penalise any features or exaggerations which they consider would be detrimental to the soundness, health and well being of the dog.”

PUPPY – for dogs of six and not exceeding twelve calendar months of age on the day of the Show
JUNIOR – for dogs of six and not exceeding eighteen calendar months of age on the day of the Show
YEARLING – for dogs of twelve and not exceeding twenty four calendar months of age on the day of the Show
GRADUATE – for dogs which have not won a Challenge Certificate or four or more First prizes at Championship Shows in Graduate, Post Graduate, Minor Limit, Mid Limit, Limit and Open classes, whether restricted or not
POST GRADUATE – for dogs which have not won a Challenge Certificate or five or more First prizes at Championship in Post Graduate, Minor Limit, Mid Limit, Limit and Open classes whether restricted or not
LIMIT – for dogs which have not become Show Champions under the Kennel Club Regulations or under the rules of any governing body recognised by the Kennel Club or won 7 or more First prizes in all at Championship Shows in Limit and Open. Classes confined to the Breed, whether restricted or not at Shows where Challenge Certificates were offered for the Breed.
OPEN – for all dogs of the Breed for which the class is provided and eligible for entry at the Show
SPECIAL VETERAN – for dogs of the Breed not less than SEVEN years of age on the first day of the Show
ANY VARIETY MEMBER STAKES – restricted to Gundogs owners must be fully paid up Members of The Southern Society for Irish Red & White Setters
NOT FOR COMPETITION – Societies may at their discretion, accept Not for Competition entries. Societies may accept such entries from breeds of dog not included within the title of the Society and at Shows held over more than one day, such entries may be accepted on any day from any breed

REGULATION FOR THE PREPARATIONS OF DOGS FOR EXHIBITION F(b)

1 These Regulations must be observed when a dog is prepared for exhibition for any Kennel Club Licensed event. Objections may be referred to the General Committee for disciplinary action under these Show Regulations and/or for disciplinary action under Kennel Club Rule A42.

- a) A dog found to have been exhibited in breach of the new Regulations will automatically be disqualified from exhibition at the show and from any award gained thereat
 - b) Unless the exhibitor provides a satisfactory explanation for the dog being exhibited in breach of these Regulations then he/she may be subject to further penalties of either a fine or as listed under Rule A42
- 2 a) No substance which alters the natural colour, texture or body of the coat may be present in the dog's coat for any purpose at any time during the show. No substance which alters the natural colour of any external part of the dog may be present on the dog for any purpose at any time during the show.

b) Any other substance (other than water) which may be used in the preparation of a dog for exhibition must not be allowed to remain in the coat or on any other part of the dog at the time of exhibition.

3 No act or operation which alters the natural conformation of a dog or any part thereof may be performed except:-

- a) Operations certified to the satisfaction of the General Committee
- b) the removal of dewclaws of any breed
- c) operations to prevent breeding provided that such operations are notified to the Kennel Club before neutered dogs are shown

Nor must anything be done calculated, in the opinion of the General Committee, to deceive

4 The General Committee without previous notice may order an examination of any dog or dogs at any Show. Any examination thus ordered will be made by a person having executive authority who shall have a written directive from the Kennel Club in their possession. Samples may be taken for further examination and analysis

5 An individual has the right to lodge an objection to a dog only if he/she is the owner or handler of a dog competing in the same breed or class. An objection may, however, be lodged by an official of the Show or by anyone so deputed by the Kennel Club. It will be the responsibility of the individual who lodged the objection or the official (as appropriate) to substantiate the grounds for the objection. The Kennel Club will substantiate the grounds for an objection made on its behalf

6 Any objection by an individual related to an infringement of these regulations must be made in writing to the Show Secretary at his/her office before the close of the Show and the individual must produce evidence of identity at the time of lodging the complaint

VIDEO RECORDING

It is acceptable to video a general overview of the show and to video the performance of your own dogs. It is also acceptable to video other exhibitors and their dogs provided that consent is given. However it cannot be considered good practice to seek to video where consent has not been given and/or where such recording is clearly unwelcome and unwanted. This would also apply equally whether the person is an exhibitor or otherwise. Should the use of a video become invasive and unwelcome then the user must abide by any request or direction to cease.

DIRECTIONS TO THE VENUE

FROM THE M4 – Leave the motorway at Junction 13 and follow signs to Chieveley off the roundabout (1st exit after M4 westbound). Go through the village and as you come out of Chieveley the Sports Centre is on the right

FROM THE NORTH (A34) – Follow the A34 and follow signs for the M4. At the motorway roundabout go nearly all the way round and follow signs to Chieveley (1st exit after M4 westbound). Go through the village and as you come out of Chieveley the Sports Centre is on the right

19 DOGS IN CARS ON HOT DAYS Your dog is vulnerable and at risk during hot weather and the Kennel Club offers the following guidance to help guide you through the do's and don'ts travelling to and whilst at KC licensed events:-

- 1 When travelling to a show please take a moment to consider whether the route to the show is on a busy holiday route, and leave earlier to avoid increased time in traffic jams
- 2 If your vehicle is not air-conditioned seriously consider whether travelling to the show is a good idea at all
- 3 The vehicle should be as fully ventilated as possible, and plenty of stops should be taken with lots of water available to drink
- 4 Ensure your dog is not sitting in full sunlight. There should be plenty of free flowing air around the dog.
- 5 When at the show, never leave your dog in the vehicle
- 6 Keep the dog in the shade – take your own shade for example a large umbrella and always have plenty of water available to drink so your dog stays well hydrated
- 7 Avoid your dog taking part in unnecessary exertion, or from standing in exposed sunlight for extended lengths of time. Remember, if you feel hot your dog is very likely to feel much hotter and dehydrated, and this could lead to dire results. Please look after your dog's welfare

WARNING: IF YOUR DOG IS FOUND TO BE AT RISK FORCIBLE ENTRY TO YOUR VEHICLE MAY BE NECESSARY WITHOUT LIABILITY FOR DAMAGE CAUSED

Anyone whose dog is entered at a Kennel Club licensed event should take all reasonable steps to ensure the needs of their dog(s) are met, and should not put a dog's health and welfare at risk by any action, default, omission or otherwise. Breach of Kennel Club Regulations in this respect may be referred to the General Committee for disciplinary action under Kennel Club Rules and Regulations. Right to Refuse Entries. Exhibitors/Competitors are reminded that show societies have the right under Kennel Club Regulation to refuse any entry

- 20 Any owner, competitor, handler or other person in charge of a dog is required to remove as soon as possible any fouling caused by their dog(s) at any Kennel Club licensed show within the licensed venue and within the environs of that event including car and caravan parks and approaches. Anyone failing to clear up will be reported to the Committee who may enforce the right to refuse entries from that exhibitor for future shows.
 - 21 The owner, exhibitor, handler or other person in charge of a dog at Kennel Club licensed events must at all times ensure that the dog is kept under proper control whilst at the licensed venue, including its environs, car and caravan parks and approaches
 - 22 A dog may be disqualified by the General Committee from any award, whether an objection has been lodged or not, if proved amongst other things to have been registered or recorded as having been bred by the scheduled Judge. This shall not apply to a Judge appointed in an emergency.
 - 23 Every exhibitor shall ensure that whilst the dog is being exhibited, its handler shall display the correct ring number.
- EXERCISE AREA An exercise area will be provided. Exhibitors/handlers are required to clear up any fouling by the dog(s) in their charge

DEFINITION OF CLASSES

In the following definitions a Challenge Certificate includes any Show award that counts towards the title of Champion under the Rules of any governing body recognised by The Kennel Club.

Wins at Championship Shows in Breed classes where Challenge Certificates are not on offer shall be counted as wins at Open Shows. In the case of a dog owned in partnership and entered in Members' classes or competing for Members Specials each partner must at the time of entry be a Member of the Society. In estimating the number of awards won, all wins up to and including the seventh day before the date of closing of entries shall be counted when entering for any class ie **8th June 2012**

Wins in variety classes do not count for entry in Breed classes but when entering Variety classes wins in both breed and variety classes must be counted. A first prize does not include a special prize of whatever value. If an exhibitor reports before the judging of a class or classes that a dog has been entered which is ineligible the exhibitor may choose one of the following options:-

- 1 **Withdrawal.** The dog may be withdrawn from competition subject to the conditions of Regulation 9(j) and 20
- 2 **Transfer.** A) If a dog is ineligible for a class or classes as regards its breed, colour, sex, weight or height the Show Secretary shall transfer it to the equivalent class or classes for the correct breed, colour, sex, weight or height and, or in the event of there being no equivalent class, Minor Puppy and Puppy excepted, to the Open Class for the correct breed, colour, sex, weight, height. B) If an exhibit entered incorrectly in a Minor Puppy class, Puppy class or Junior Class, which is over age but under 12 calendar months, 18 calendar months of age, or 24 calendar months of age respectively, the Show Secretary shall transfer the exhibit to the Puppy class, Junior class or Yearling class respectively for the correct breed, colour, sex, weight or height, and in the event of there being no Puppy, Junior or Yearling class respectively to the Open Class for the correct breed, colour, sex, weight, height. C) For any reason other than the above, the Show Secretary shall transfer it to the Open class for the correct breed, colour, sex, weight, height. D) If an exhibit arrives late and misses a class, even if it is the only class in which the dog is entered, the dog may not be transferred to any other class
